Master's Thesis, prospective completion date spring of 2023. A reading which interprets the sensationalized story of the historical murderess Sada Abe through a lens of post-facto feminist archeology. Reading a degree of moral distance and existential agency often only afforded to accounts of violence that uphold misogyny, this project seeks to append the critical distance between researcher and subject and earnestly investigate what it might mean culturally and libidinally for a woman to love a man so much it drives her to murder.

"Are they both you?" Tracing the Lives of Meta-Cinema and the female Nonidentity.

Bachelor's essay in film studies, completed Spring 2021. Focuses on the centrality of the feminine image to the cinematic tradition, and aggregates a disparate progression of films whose individual interrogations of the multiplicity of identities formed around that image signify a deconstruction and hypertrophy of the medium at large.

"Terrible Joy and No Less Terrible Despair:" Sublimation and Psychoanalysis in Oscar Wilde's the portrait of Mr. W.H.

Something Borrowed, Something Dead: The Psychic love story of Mrs. W.B Yeats and her automatic script's place in the tradition of Modernist L'écriture Feminine.

Project completed during the Summer of 2019 and presented in the Fall in fulfillment of a grant from the Summer Undergraduate Research with Faculty SURF program at the College of Charleston. Research entailed working with archival material in the National Library of Ireland to produce a historical feminist re-reading of George Hyde-Lee's lifelong practice of automatic writing as psycho-spiritual creative product, influencing her husband W.B. Yeats' poetry and asserting her as its collaborative co-author.
